ome time ago the Parish Council was contacted by Crabtree Homes Ltd asking if we would meet with them to discuss their proposal to build 29 dwellings on the green belt land at the rear of Smithy Lane and Smithy Close. We decided not to arrange any meetings as we took the view that there is absolutely nothing that Crabtree Homes could say that would cause us to change our total opposition to any new development within the green belt.

Sometime later we were informed by Knowsley Council that Crabtree Housing had applied for outline planning approval for their plan to construct 29 new houses within the green belt. The item was placed on the agenda for our full council meeting to be held in September which is normal practice for our consideration of planning applications. Although we have no powers in respect of planning approval we are a statutory consultee and experience has shown that Knowsley Council take our comments very seriously.

In line with our policy on the green belt a document outlining our reasons for objecting to the proposal was prepared prior to the meeting. The meeting was attended by many residents, so many

in fact that not all could fit into the council office. The document was put before members and was unanimously adopted. Our objections were forwarded to Knowsley Council the following day.

The council Chairman suspended the meeting to allow discussion with residents and to listen to all comments. It became very clear that all those present objected to the proposed development. Advice was given on how to object and valid reasons for objecting. After the meeting dwellings directly affected by the proposal were leafletted with similar advice.

Over the next few days Knowsley Council received over 50 objections with only I person supporting the development.

This was very critical and is very likely the reason Crabtree Homes have withdrawn the application. This is not necessarily the end of the matter. Crabtree Homes may make a new application in the future after studying all the objections. Any new application may be an attempt to address the objections in the hope that the application would be approved. Crabtree Homes will never be able to overcome Policy C5 of the Knowsley Local Plan which clearly states that " inappropriate development in the Green Belt is not permitted". New housing is defined as

being inappropriate development. It is for this reason that Crabtree Homes are trying to argue special circumstances.

In any event should a new application be submitted please be assured that the Parish Council will again oppose such an application and will again assist residents.

All Parish Council members found it gratifying that so many of you took time to attend the September meeting. Perhaps Crabtree Homes under estimated the sense of Community in Cronton and took the view that your Parish Council was not particularly pro-active. If this is their view then they are clearly wrong.

I would like to thank all of you who objected to the application, the number of objections can be very important in any planning consideration. Should a further application be submitted I urge you to again object.




Cronton Garden Centre

CUTS TO POLICING

Councils within the Merseyside area have been contacted by the Police and Crime Commissioner to inform them of the impending cuts to the Merseyside Police budget.

In short Merseyside Police will have to save £48 million by the end of the financial year 2018/2019. This is in addition to the £77 million already cut since 2010. With this amount of cuts only severe reductions in the levels of policing can occur.

If all PCSO posts were cut during 2016, the mounted section disbanded and the basic command structure dissolved £28 million will have to be saved by 2018/2019.

This means that every team within Merseyside Police is facing cuts. This includes the teams of officers and staff who investigate sex offences, hate crimes and the Matrix teams who
