nowsley Borough Council is not allowed by Central Government to increase its Council Tax by more than 2% per annum. So far Knowsley has met this obligation each year by cost cutting of personnel and some facilities. These cuts, until now, have largely gone unnoticed by the electors within the Borough as there have been no appreciable cuts in the services supplied by Knowsley. Unfortunately. these cuts have met a buffer and to achieve the desired income v expenditure, cuts are now being made in the services provided. This will not affect rubbish collection. street cleansing or other statutory obligations but will affect the level of support given upkeep of recreational areas.

Knowsley has since 1972 met the costs of upkeep of the Pasture (Recreational Area) but can now no longer to do so, and if we wish to keep the high standard of this area, the cost of upkeep will have to be met by the Parish.

Also, due to government legislation we are bound to give our employees the opportunity of contributing to a retirement pension and our Clerk has indicated her wish to do so.

Precept 2015 - 2016

To meet these extra costs on the Parish, the precept has had to be increased from £13,845 to

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£21,252. This is an enormous percentage increase (51%) but amounts to an increase of 31p per week per Band-D household. The

general view of these costs have been carefully considered by the Parish Council and the view of the village in a straw poll. There is no scope for savings on this amount, other than to allow the Pasture to be untended - this was considered unacceptable by villagers and Parish Council. Also, the increased costs will be directly spent for the benefit of the Village in maintaining the Pasture as a recreational area. and if not on the Parish Precept the cost would have been added to the Borough Council Tax.

Costs for maintaining the Pasture were put out to tender and that considered giving the best value for money accepted. The service given to the Pasture will be reviewed at 3 monthly intervals, but your observations would be gratefully received.

We are not the only Town or Parish Council affected, Halewood, Whiston and Knowsley Village Councils are similarly affected, but are meeting some of the extra costs in the first year from reserves – Cronton does not have the luxury of those monetary reserves.


Boundary Review Consultation

nowsley Borough Council has formally asked the Boundary Commission to review the ward boundaries within Knowsley. This is with a view to reducing the number of Ward Councillors from 63 to 45 Councillors so that each Councillor represents an average of 6000 electors. This is in essence a cost cutting exercise as our current representation is for about 4500 electors per councillor.

Our Ward, Whiston will still have 3
Councillors but North Whiston and South
Whiston with Cronton will be combined
and be called Whiston – each councillor
in Whiston will have and increased
workload from 4500 to 6000 electors
giving a saving on expenses to Knowsley
for a total of 18 councillors and still
(theoretically) allows 3 members per ward
to adequately discharge their roles.
These effects are scheduled to come into
effect in the local elections of 2016. The
external boundaries of Knowsley remain
unaffected.

On the representation front, Whiston will still have its 3 Ward Councillors but their work load will be significantly increased by a factor of 40% impacting on the attention they can give to a specific area.

Another aspect is that Cronton will not be named as part of the Ward and the new Ward will just be called Whiston. Your Parish Council think that this is unfair and made representations to the Local Government Boundary Commission to this effect. The new ward should be called Whiston and Cronton and this has historically always been so and can truly reflect the interests and identities of Cronton. The Cronton area is a large chunk of Whiston, the interactive maps are posted on the Commission's consultation portal at: http://www.lgbce.org.uk/node/3670. The portal



also allows visitors to submit comments and alternative proposals. <u>The consultation</u> <u>closes on 6 April 2015</u>.
