he Parish Council continues to support and promote the interests of the residents of Cronton with Knowsley Metropolitan Borough Council (KMBC), the Ward Councillors and other public bodies.

We have continued to receive good community services with particularly relevant to the cleanliness of the village, care of local spaces, hedgerows and lighting. There is however, still a way to go in the state of the pavements, road surface and drainage, although there are continued initiatives to improve these services. For example pot holes are regularly repaired and the surface of Hall Lane has been resurfaced. Since the withdrawal of much of the government funding to the Metropolitan Borough Council we have started to see an increased deterioration in the number of Pot Holes particularly on Smithy Lane and Penny Lane. Resurfacing on Smithy Lane is promised to be done during the coming School holidays. We continue to get an excellent waste collection service and fly-

tipping is promptly cleared up.

Since the drains in the Village have been overhauled, especially at the village end of Penny Lane, on the A5080 at the end of Wheatfield and on Smith Lane outside the School, this seems to have solved the problem in Smithy Lane and other areas of the Village. There was serious contamination of the Brook but actions taken have cleared up the Brook and it continues to improve with time.

The next improvement to the Pasture is planned to be fixing of the poor drainage in this area, to this end a survey to investigate the feasibility of drainage has been instigated by 20-20 with a view to applying for grants to improve the drainage of the Pasture to facilitate the leisure and sporting activities on the Pasture. Knowsley MBC has maintained the Pasture to our Green Flag status, but will now no longer be going to support this maintenance. The Village through the Parish Council has taken on this responsibility by putting the cost onto the Precept.

We have continued to receive good policing in the Village; the Police have been particularly active in dealing with illegal parking at the schools and on double yellow lines. There is still some speeding in the village, but the introduction of the 20mph zones seem to have helped. A special thanks to Dave Rimmer, our PCSO who has recently resigned from the Police and we wish him every success for the future.

Network meetings are held every 3 months and have continued to be well attended. These meetings act as an important vehicle for the voice of the community to be heard and are an excellent adjunct to the Parish Council.

You may never have been to church; you may not have been for years and you may only have been to church for baptisms, weddings and funerals – but you are always welcome to join us. This was held in Cronton for the first time, so we had Confirmation candidates from four churches confirmed by the new Bishop of Liverpool - who seemed very much at home here in Cronton. We no longer have our own dedicated vicar in Cronton. As in many parishes, East Widnes has a small clergy team (two vicars and a curate) covering four churches, supported by a team of licenced Lay Readers. The whole team work in every church on a rota, so everyone on the team leads services in every church and no church has a single vicar.

Our clergy team is led by Revd Helen Blackburn, assisted by Revd Lyn McIver and our curate – Revd Laura Leatherbarrow. Revd Lyn McIver has key responsibility for Cronton – she is in school and around the village every Monday. Have a chat if you see her around – she wants to get to know people.
