**We must again thank the Cronton Garden Centre for their generous support together with the volunteers who regularly water the plants.**

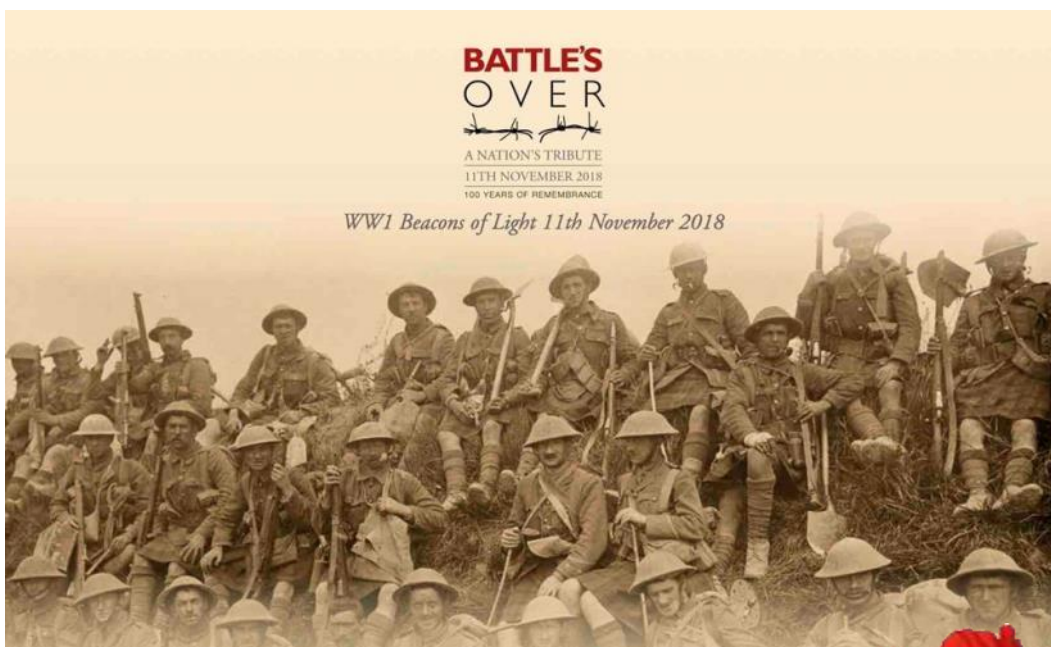

# Service of Remembrance Sunday 11th November 2018

The annual service of remembrance  
will take place at 10.45 am  
on Sunday 11 November  
at Coronation Gardens

This year particular tribute will be paid to all of  
those who lost their lives in the first world war  
which ended 100 years ago.



In remembrance of the end of the war and the millions who were killed or came home dreadfully wounded, Beacons of Light will be lit around the country at 7pm on 11th November 2018.

The event will also commemorate the huge army of men and women on the home front who, often in dangerous and exhausting conditions, underpinned the war effort - keeping the wheels of industry turning and bringing home the harvests. The beacons will symbolise the light of hope that emerged from the darkness of war. *(Extract)*

The interpretation boards for Coronation Gardens and St Anne's Well are going to be installed in approximately 6 weeks.

### *Cronton Village (extract)*



This ancient village was called Crwenton: Settlement of the Crows, by the Saxons, and despite its proximity to industrialized Widnes,

Cronton retains its village life, its sense of history and its rural setting. With a long recorded past, unique buildings, rural industries and village crafts, Cronton is a rare survivor in the Modern Age. And it is still favoured by the glossy, garrulous crows!

### *St Anne's Well (extract)*

St. Anne's was a natural well with a great flow of water, which was said to cure rheumatic patients. It was back-filled in the late nineteenth century, when the water was 'poisoned' by the body of a dead animal. In the past, the ancient stocks were positioned close to the well, which was also known as a Stocks Well (dedicated to St. Anne). Old maps show Stocks Well Lane leading to the stocks. Many believe the well to be late Medieval in origin, when the cult of St. Anne had become widespread in England.

### **How would you like Knowsley to look by 2030?**
