The Pasture Update

t is now over 11 years since the Pasture had any significant upgrade and investment that included installation of land drainage, play equipment renewal, the installation of wooden park sculptures along with new gates and signage.

Of course time has taken its toll and now we are at the stage when reinvestment is required and to that end Cronton Parish Council are working alongside Knowsley Borough Council to seek funding and to create a new Pasture Master Plan.

The potential projects under discussion are:

- Upgrade/replacement of play equipment.
- Installation of an all-weather perimeter footpath to enable all year accessibility.
- Renewal of park sculptures with a view to a more sustainable design.
- ♦ Re-painting of fences and welcome sign refurbishment.
- Ongoing development of the wild flower area that has been in full bloom this year.

To further these objectives we will be embarking on a consultation process in both an electronic and printed format (that is included in this newsletter) along with consultation with the two schools.

watch Campaign.

Speed watch is not about enforcement but is totally about educating drivers about speed awareness and bringing about changes in bad driving habits.

The Parish Council has been provided with a hand held speed detection device and a number of councillors have received training in its operation.

In the near future you will see the equipment being used around the village. Details of vehicles found to be exceeding the speed limit will be recorded and the information will be passed to Merseyside Police. Particular attention will be paid to the area around the two village schools.

Registered keepers of vehicles found to be speeding will receive a letter from Merseyside Police warning

that can arise from exceeding speed limits. No fixed penalties will be issued. If a trend of speeding vehicles at a particular location is detected then Merseyside Police may mount an enforcement operation.

In addition to monitoring speeding vehicles inappropriate parking will be monitored particularly where vehicles parked on the pavement cause an obstruction to pedestrians. The Parish Council has been provided with notices explaining the risks to pedestrians due to inappropriate parking and these will be placed on the windscreens of vehicles causing problems. Again this is not about enforcement but is aimed at making drivers more considerate when it comes to parking vehicles.

It is hoped that this campaign will result in a reduction of speeding vehicles in the village

COVID-19

he last 18 months have been difficult for all of us. The Covid pandemic has impacted negatively on all of our lives. Sadly many people have lost their lives or suffered severe illness from this terrible disease.

The Parish Council sends its condolences to family members and friends of those who have sadly succumbed to Covid-19.

In March 2020 the country faced total lockdown. The response in Cronton was one of community spirit with volunteers coming forward offering to collect shopping or prescriptions for those who could not leave

their homes. In a very short period all households had received offers of help. Our thanks go to all of the volunteers and the wider Cronton community for their actions during that very challenging time.

The lockdown caused problems for how the Parish Council operated. The government issued strict guidelines to all councils which required them to meet remotely. The Parish Council decided to hold its meetings via Zoom. This was something totally new to most coun-

cillors but after a few teething problems we were able to continue acting in the interest of Cronton residents. Arrangements were made to allow members of the public to successfully attend the remote meetings and take part in the public participation part of the agenda.

We were also able to successfully launch the new Cronton Village and Parish Council website.

The council office was closed to community groups and the service of Remembrance and Christmas celebra-

tions were cancelled.

Fortunately we are getting back to some form of normality with face to face meetings now being held and the council office is once again being used by local community groups.

There is still uncertainty about Covid infection rates and the Parish Council will consider all relevant data when making decisions.

We are pleased to once again produce the newsletter. Not all of the news is negative. There are some positive things to report in this issue.

Multi use path

junction with

nowsley MBC are proposing, as part of a government funded scheme, a multi-use path, for cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders, from Prescot to Widnes via Cronton, to join up with the Trans Pennine trail.

Phases 8 & 9 of the scheme will go through Cronton.

Phase 8, will be from the new Country Park located on the eastern side of the former Cronton Colliery site, crossing Foxes Bank Lane and then skirting the edge of the adjacent field, to meet up with the western end of Penny Lane.

Phase 9, will then be from Penny Lane to Hall Lane, crossing the Smithy Lane, down Woburn Drive left on to Hampton Drive and

to Kenley Avenue. It will then cross the Cronton Road, at a revamped crossing adjacent to the Community Centre and travel along the Cronton Road to Sandy Lane, on a widened footpath.

Please note that Phase 8 of the project, requires planning permission, the documents to be submitted in the very near future.



Phase 9, does not require planning approval and will be signage only through the village. The widening of the footpath on the south side of the Cronton Road, will only commence after extensive drainage work has been carried out, between Sandy Lane and the Community Centre.
