number of people have asked about the origin of the Parish Council crest.


The **crow** at the top of the crest represents the 16th century name for Cronton which was Crowenston.





The left hand panel has a sheaf of

corn to represent the farms with the village







The right hand panel has a beehive which represents the old pub of that name which was sited opposite the site of the current chip shop at the junction of Smithy Lane and Cronton Road.

The tools below the beehive represent the making of watch parts which took place in the terraced cottages at Town End. The parts were taken to Prescot

which at one time had a thriving

watch making industry.



The bottom panel is the stone cross situated at the junction of Smithy Lane and Hall Lane.

Village artist Allan Evans painted a large copy of the crest which can be seen above the stage at Cronton Community Centre.

Speed Indication Devices

ou may have noticed in the past that we have, on occasions, had the temporary use of a speed indication device



which was placed in Smithy Lane opposite the C of E school. We are convinced these devices have a positive impact on speed reduction.

You also may have noticed that in neighbouring Widnes there are a number of these devices some very close to the Cronton border and most of them have been funded by local neighbourhood groups in association with Halton Council.

We are also mindful that there is significant housing development on our borders both in Whiston and Widnes and this will inevitably put extra pressure on our roads in particular Cronton Road and Smithy Lane. Our aim is to provide two devices to be located in these areas.

These SID devices are a considerable cost in the region of 4.5/5K and our plan is that the Parish Council will plan to save some reserves to meet these costs over the forthcoming years but of course this will take some time. With that in mind it was proposed to follow the Halton model in pursuing the possibility of embarking on a local vil-

pursuing the possibility of embarking on a local village funding appeal that would undoubtedly accelerate the process **so**

Parking

Inappropriate and selfish parking has become a problem in the village particularly outside the two village schools and along Cronton Road.

Wheelchair users, those with pushchairs and pedestrians in general should not have to walk in the road due to vehicles being parked on the pavement. It is particularly dangerous on Cronton Road which is a busy major route.

The Parish Council are liaising with Merseyside Police and Knowsley Highways Department to try and resolve the problem.

Merseyside Police did have a scheme which allowed residents to report inappropriate parking but we are not certain if the scheme is still running. The Neighbourhood Police Sergeant is looking into this matter for us.

We are aware that many of the vehicles causing the problem are owned by people who do not live in the village but we do ask residents to be considerate when parking.

DOG FOULING/PROBLEMS WITH RATS IN THE VILLAGE



The Parish Council have been made aware of a problem with rats in Cronton. It is not unusual to see vermin during winter, however there are some actions residents can take to avoid infestation.

- old wooden decking will provide a safe and dry home for vermin.
- rubbish piles at your property will harbour rats.
- bird seed and other food for birds will attract vermin.

Precept 2022/23

Each year the Parish Council agrees a budget for the new financial year which begins on 1st April.



This year Councillors have been very conscious of the increases in the cost of living affecting all of us. Accordingly, the Parish Council has produced a budget which does not require an increase in the parish precept (the amount of money we take from you each year).

There will be no change to how the Parish Council operates and the Parish Council office will still be available free of charge to Cronton community groups.

The Remembrance and Christmas services will still be funded as will the annual grant scheme.

The precept figure is calculated using a formula which produces a band D equivalent amount.

The band D equivalent for the year 2022/23 is the same as last year at £49.83 which is approximately 96p per week.

Speed Watch Scheme

s previously reported the Parish Council has signed up to the Merseyside Police speed watch scheme with a number of Councillors being trained in the use of a handheld speed detector device. The intention was that speeding motorists would receive advisory letters about speeding. It was not intended to be an enforcement operation but one of educating drivers about speeding.

Unfortunately, the roll out of the scheme was stalled due to the Covid-19 pandemic and there is some uncertainty about the viability of the scheme.

The Parish Council has asked Merseyside Police if the trained Councillors can mount monitoring operations whilst the future of the scheme is decided.

s detailed in our previous newsletter the Parish Council is working with Knowsley Council to develop a new Pasture Master Plan to provide significant improvement to the park includ-

- Replacement of play equipment in a more sustainable format i.e. non-combustible.
- Replacement of the sculpture trail again in a more sustainable format.
- The installation of an upper area perimeter path to allow all year safe access.
- Re-painting of entrance and play area metal fencing.

To fund this we are pursuing via the Borough Council grants that support green space and sporting facilities, and we are hopeful that in the near future we can commence these processes and achieve our objectives.
