Back in 1989 I founded the Cronton Clean up Campaign that became the Cronton Pathways Project. Regular village clean up days have been held over that period and have continued over the years removing considerable amounts of

The new exit at the Holy Family car park is now functional, this will hopefully increase usage and so lessen on road parking. For safety reasons double yellow lines have been installed in Hall Lane to hopefully deter on road parking if they are effective.

Knowsley Council parking officers have made two recent visits with a particular focus on pavement parking and issued advice tickets on the offending vehicles to highlight the issue.

**Y**ou may recall from a previous newsletter that we alongside Knowsley Council were jointly applying for funding via a third party charity to implement significant improvements to the Pasture including the installation of an all weather perimeter pathway that will allow walking access throughout the year and the replacement of the wood sculptures plus other ground-work improvements.
